New Step 6 Divisions Allocated

The National League System structural review took another stride forward this week as the FA's Leagues Committee formally ratified the decision to award the ownership and control to the two new Step 6 divisions which launch from next season.

A new division in the North West area will be managed by the North West Counties League and the Essex/East Anglian area division will come under the Eastern Counties banner. Work between the FA and the leagues will continue over the coming months in order to determine membership within the divisions.

The North West Counties are expected to operate with North and South divisions whilst the Eastern Counties offer, as part of a joint venture with the Essex Senior League, includes the introduction of Senior League officials to their Management Committee structure.

Ray Lewis, FA League Committee Chair, said: "Both of the applications that were ratified on Tuesday (3 October) were very thorough and of a high standard. The Leagues Committee decided to implement a similar process as to the one utilised for the new Step 3 & 4 divisions, as this had previously served us well. The need for an extra division in the North West was apparent due to the amount of Step 7 leagues in the area and for the Essex area not to have a Step 6 division was also a long-term concern of the Committee."

The three ESL Management Committee members that will sit on the new league, which will be called the Easter Senior League will be Martyn Fitch, Michelle Dorling and Robert Errington, who will combine their current duties on the ESL committee with those they will undertake on the new Step 6 league.

The league will be geographically split between north and south of Ipswich, but is dependent on the actual constitution. Any clubs that join this new league, even if they have come from the Eastern Counties League will be promoted to the Essex Senior League, as long as they meet ground grading criteria. Appointment of Match Officials will be arranged by the East Anglian Pool who currently operation with the ECL.

This new league will now allow promotion and relegation to exist between Step 7, through a Step 6 league and then onto Step 5. In recent years it has been possible for clubs from Step 7 to enter Step 5 in Essex but there has been an anomaly in that there have been no movements the other way.



Pond Strikes Twice To See Off West Essex

On a fairly calm night at Mile End Stadium, Tower Hamlets welcomed West Essex in a Friday night Essex Senior League encounter. Regarding the teams, Goalkeeper James Pellin made his debut for Hamlets after signing from Southend Manor while for West Essex, Dan Russell continued to deputise in goal for the injured Jack Coker.

The match didn't start off that lively with few chances coming in the early-going. Fourteen minutes in, a West Essex free-kick by Joe Lefley found centre-back Maamoon Khan though he couldn't get his shot away on goal. Six minutes later, we had the unusual sight of a fox traversing its way across the pitch. On 24 minutes, Hamlets forward O'Neal Rowe had a good shot saved by West Essex goalkeeper Dan Russell. The remainder of the half saw few real opportunities to break the deadlock though a minute before the break, visiting defender Kofi Appiah's drive needed a decent save by Hamlets goalkeeper James Pellin to keep it goalless at the interval.

The hosts took a few minutes to settle after the break, though ten minutes after the re-start, striker Luke With hit a post from a decent position in the area. The visitors nearly responded a minute later though skipper Tom MacLeod's header went over the bar from a free-kick. Hamlets did opening the scoring on

59 minutes as hot-shot Curtis Pond made a good surging run and buried a low shot past Russell to give the hosts the lead. Hamlets were unsurprisingly buoyed by their goal and full-back Lamar Earle made another good run though blasted his shot over the bar. The visitors were a man down as Dan Christey was dismissed for two bookable offences midway through the second half. With had another effort on goal saved by Russell's legs with 66 minutes on the clock though three minutes later Pond was left in space and one-on-one with Russell, again placed a low drive into the corner.

The hosts had the initiative now and nearly increased their lead as Rowe showed good pace and skill to get past Russell in the area though his goal-bound effort was well blocked on the goal-line. Two minutes after coming on as a late substitute, forward Wale Odedoyin found space on the counter-attack and lobbed Russell well to seal the win for Ade Abayomi

and AJ Ashinike's side. To be honest, the visitors did tire after the break though Pellin still had to deny striker Michael Mignot and substitute Isaac Marfo late on.

All in all, the second-half showing from Hamlets won them this match and Curtis Pond laid down another marker in terms of his finishing with two goals though Luke With, O'Neal Rowe and defender John Watson also did well tonight. For West Essex, this won't be a memorable match as they struggled to give the likes of Mignot and Woodbridge enough service up top. They will have better matches this season though there may be a concern about conceding goals. Best wishes to both clubs.

Motormen triumph in match cut short by injury at Southchurch Park

On a fairly chilly afternoon at Southchurch Park, Southend Manor welcomed in-form Redbridge in another Essex Senior League encounter on Non-League Day.

The first began with the visitors edging the early-going though 13 minutes in, it was almost bad luck for the visitors as from full-back Lee Scott's right-wing cross, Manor's Robbie Norris scuffed his shot at the near post. The visitors did get into their stride somewhat though strikes on goal from front two Brian Moses and Calvin Poku failed to find the target.

The Motormen did take the lead eleven minutes before the break as a long-ball found Poku in space and then one-on-one with Manor goalkeeper Liam Pitts, buried his low strike into the left corner. Redbridge led at the break as Manor couldn't quite find their rhythm going forward though did battle quite well against the formidable Motormen front four.

Seven minutes into the second half, Moses' shot was saved by Pitts, A minute later, Manor forward Bayley Newell's drive went wide of the left-side post. The visitors extended their lead on 61 minutes as after Moses was involved in the build-up , winger Reside Coxi-Sebastfao struck home from close range. Ten minutes later, Manor substitute Charlie Barlow's shot called Redbridge goalkeeper Lewis Greene into action though he made the save.

Soon after, the visitors were three goals up as after Pitts had denied Moses' effort, winger Joshua Hutchinson tucked in the re-bounce. Newell then tested Greene again with a goal-bound effort which the visiting custodian saved with his foot.

With ten minutes remaining, there was a coming together as Redbridge forward Moses and home goalkeeper Pitts challenged for the ball on the edge of the goalkeeper's area which left both players down. However, it soon became apparent that the 'keeper had clearly come off worse for wear and the match was halted while an ambulance was called. I must mention that Moses stayed with the stricken stopper for some time, before and after the paramedic crew arrived. Given the situation, the referee eventually called the match off with ten minutes still to play. Pitts suffered a suspected broken leg. I sincerely wish Liam the very best in his recovery and I am sure the entire Non-League community would also echo that sentiment.

As far as the result goes, the League will ultimately decide whether the result will stand or not, though at present I believe it may stand.

Burnham Ramblers 4 Sporting Bengal United 1

Wickers Cooked By Coockey



Barkingside 3 Hackney Wick 0 (Premier Division)

Tony Coockey came off the subs bench in the 55th minute and Hackney Wick probably wished he hadn't as the Barkingside talisman went on to score all his side's goals in Monday evening's 3-0 win at Cricklefield.

The first half didn't offer up much in way of chances. Bradley Gayer floated over an early free kick that Garrett Kelly was able to head on target but Gabriel Pietrzyk saved it with ease. Hackney Wick then went close when a corner ball glided across the Side goalmouth before being poked into the side-netting by Jeffrey Idemudia. Moments later Euan Taylor-Reid headed a corner inches over the Hackney Wick cross bar.

The Wickers do like to play the ball around the midfield but lacked cutting edge up front although Hunt did have to work hard to parry a Sergo Sidibe free kick before having to quickly smother the loose ball before Alejandro Ramires had time to chase onto it.

The hosts perhaps created the best chances of the half towards the end of the opening forty-five with Charlie Little's header causing Pietrzyk all kinds of trouble, his initial save palming the ball away before requiring a couple of attempts to get the ball under his possession. The Wickers keeper had less trouble cutting out an Aaron Lesta grasscutter, getting down low to stop the shot. However Lesta should have done better with the last chance of the half as he did a step-over to beat one Hackney Wick defender, took on and beat another, before losing his footing and therefore losing possession before he could get a fire a shot at the Wickers goal.

Hackney Wick had the first chance of the second period when a deep cross from the left found Alejandro Ramires who then fired his shot into the side-netting. Then entered Cookey whose first involvement saw him sending over a cross towards Michael Ogboin and Charlie Little; alas they got in each other's way and so the opening ended up coming to nothing.

Cookey then opened the scoring in the 65th minute, having three bites of the cherry

before he was able to put the ball into the net. The first shot crashed against the cross bar with Cookey having another go when he raced onto the rebound, which Pietrzyk was able to keep out. Cookey however was not going to be denied, reacting quickly to pounce on the free ball and finally finish the job off.

Jeffrey Idemudia went close with a header but then in the 75th minute Cookey struck again with a goal that was perhaps a bit more routine. A ball over the top set the Side forward free and he lobbed Pietrzyk with relative ease.

The goal effectively ended the game as Side now shut up shop at the back which meant that the Wickers had to rely on long-range efforts which were often well wide of the target.

Cookey almost added his third when his speed again placed him in a dangerous position to let rip but Pietrzyk on this occasion was able to parry the shot with Cookey then skewing the rebound wide.

However Cookey was able to complete his hat-trick in the final minute after good work from Ogboin split the Hackey Wick defence leaving Cookey with the task of finishing off at close range.

The second half started much slower than the first and Redbridge were unable to show the same cutting edge which they had produced in the opening 45 minutes.

Wadham Lodge thought they had pulled a goal back however the official ruled it offside but they were not to be denied what was their consolation when Naaman Gordon headed home straight from a corner leaving Redbridge still searching for that elusive clean sheet.

Late chances for the home side saw Coxi Sebastfao and Lindisipho Mytanda fail to increase the score line before full time was blown.
